

Cadiz Trigg County Planning Commission

The Cadiz Trigg County Planning Commission held its regularly scheduled business meeting at the City of Cadiz Meeting room at 6:00pm February 23, 2010.

Bob Brame, chairman, called the meeting to order.

Bob Brame presented the newest member, Tommy Dunn, to the committee and visitors.

Motion to approve minutes of previous minutes by Lucas Chesnut, second by Howard Stovall. Motion approved.

Motion to approve minutes of financials with a question about the \$0 in petty cash by Howard Stovall, second by Matt Ladd, motion passed.

Rezoning of Lot on Lafayette - Chairman Brame read the note from Lynn Waller in support of the rezoning, stated that the Stallons family had called, but after finding out what was happening, had no problem in the rezoning.

Motion to rezone from residential to business by Lucas Chesnut, second by Matt Ladd, motion approved.

Statement by Chairman Brame that Ray Gracity had called and indicated that his engineer had not finished the variance request and would wait until the next meeting.

Chairman Bob Brame turned the portion of the meeting about the website bids to Lucas Chesnut, Mr Chesnut wrote the specifications for the bids. Mr Chesnut went thru the specifications and the bids and made a motion to go with WK Technology Services, Ken and Dorraine Traub, seconded by Matt Ladd, motion passed.

On the website bid, the choice of monthly maintenance as needed at \$35 per hour was made into a motion by Lucas Chesnut, seconded by Howard Stovall, motion passed.

On the website bid, the choice of set up of hosting of the Economy plan at \$107.76 per two years was made into a motion with the understanding that this can be increased to the Deluxe or Unlimited plans for the different in the stated costs at any time if needed. Motion by Lucas Chesnut, seconded by Matt Ladd, motion passed.

Comments by Commissioners

Lucas Chesnut commented that we had ran into the situation where some larger construction projects have not provided the planning commission with water management plans. Bob Brame stated that KRS requires a water management plan and in many areas where the commercial building inspector is a part of the planning commission, that is where the plans are submitted. The commission might choose to consider making this a part of our requirements in the future.
